'-ed' adjectives

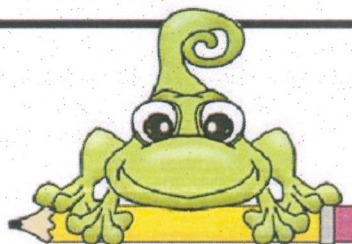
Adjectives that end in **-ed** are used to describe how people feel.
